	At the beginning of the season, I introduced a new concussion screening program that was offered here in Alliston for any players over the age of 10. With it being a new program, there was some interest but not a huge amount of success. Therefore, I am going to be spreading out flyers around upcoming tryouts and posting it on the TNT website to better help make this program known across our organization going into next season.
	At the beginning of the 2023-24 season, I am also going to be addressing all our trainers regarding some literature and guidance on dealing with shock in an injured player and its correlation to temperature control. Stay tuned for more info on this.

Butch Galbraith Referee in Chief/Assignor	We are a work in progress for refs. We are bringing in Level 3 refs for older age groups. After Covid, we are down to 1800 refs from 5300. We will be putting postings on the website for new refs.

JD Lout U9 HL Convenor	Great year. We went from half ice to full ice. Coaches worked together well. No issues.
Jamie Larocque U5/U7 Convenor	U5 Division In 2022/2023 our U5 division had a total of 23 players. 18 boys and 5 girls. Our division had 9 on ice volunteers with Jon Chapman as our lead instructor.

	For the second season in a row, we were able to acquire some extra ice time on Sundays by utilizing the empty half ice that was left empty. We had good attendance on Sundays 70% each week and the kids really enjoyed the extra ice. Some of our seasonal highlights was having the Hornets coach come out to two practices, colouring contest, Jersey Day, TNT sibling day, year end banquet.  TNT U7  In 2022/2023 our U7 division had a total of 83 players, 75 boys and 8 girls. We had a 22 coaches and volunteers on ice.  Before our season started, we had a coach meeting to develop a seasonal practice plan to help develop our players. Each practice consisted of 3-4 stations focused on various skills and a game. Each week a different team was responsible for creating a practice plan, the practice plan would be sent out every Thursday evening for review and then implemented for all teams on Saturday.  Each team on the ice would be mixed in groups based on skill ability. Players would then rotate through the stations and interact with all the coaches from each team on the ice. Our coaches did a wonderful job organizing practices each week, everything ran smoothly, and the kids had a lot of fun.  Some of our seasonal highlights included the Hornets coach coming out twice to interact with the kids, a TNT logo colouring contest, Jersey Day, TNT sibling day, and our year end banquet.  We would also like to recognize our Daniel Warzin Award winner Claire Cristan.

We have been an active member of the loop for many years, and it provides an exciting calibre of hockey for the plyers. This year we fielded one U18 team and two U!5 teams.
